



# ... suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell.

All the gospels, using different details, describe the final days of Jesus' life. One example to which you could turn is **Luke 19 – 23** where these chapters describe the last week of Jesus' life where He rode into Jerusalem on a donkey to the praise of the people (Palm Sunday) and then later that week, He celebrated the Passover with His disciples, instituted Holy Communion, went to the Mount of Olives for prayer where He was betrayed by Judas, arrested by the Romans and taken to a mock trial with Pilate, then

#### JESUS in HELL?

4. As Lutherans, we believe that Jesus went to hell during that weekend of His death, before His resurrection. Peter's letter briefly describes Jesus' decent into hell:

1 Peter 3:18,19 He was made alive ... (and) went and preached to the spirits who were in **prison** . . (spirits who lived in the time of Noah).

5. As Lutherans we believe that Jesus went to hell before His resurrection. This was not as punishment, but to proclaim *victory* over satan and all evil.

Revelation 1:18 I am the Living One; I was dead, and behold I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades.



# The third day He rose again from the dead.

The gospels give a variety of accounts of Jesus' resurrection. Jesus rose in bodily form appearing to many, many people. The resurrection distinguishes Christianity from all other faiths.

6. Jesus appeared to many people on different occasions.

1 Corinthians 15:6 Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep.

7. At the resurrection, Jesus rose in bodily form, not just as a spirit.

Luke 24: 38-43 He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate it in their presence.

1 Corinthians 15:54 When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." Read more about the Last Day, the Day of the Resurrection in 1 Corinthians 15.



... He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

#### The Ascension

Acts 1:9 And when he (Jesus) had said these things, as they (the disciples) were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

- 13. Since Jesus died for the whole world, will all people be saved *automatically* now that Jesus has done His great and mighty work?
- 2 Peter 2:1 ... even denying the sovereign Lord who <u>bought</u> them-- bringing swift destruction on themselves.
  - Acts 16:31 **Believe** in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved
- *Matthew 7:21* <u>Not everyone</u> who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven.

John 3 describes the need to be "born again"; brought into the <u>light</u> (from darkness)

Ephesians 1:4-5 describes being <u>adopted</u> into God's family. This begs to ask,

"What are we being adopted from?" Ephesians 2:1-2

14. As Lutherans, we boldly proclaim, as did the apostle Paul, the death of Jesus Christ as the ultimate event by which salvation has been won for us!

1 Corinthians 1:22-23 For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach <u>Christ crucified</u>, a stumbling block to Jews and folly (foolishness) to Gentiles,

#### What Now . . . now that we believe in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior?

Matthew 28:18-20 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore **go and make disciples** of all nations, **baptizing** them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and **teaching** them to **obey** everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

*Ephesians 2:8-10* For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith--and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-- not by works, so that no one can boast.

For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to **do good works**, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Ephesians 4:11-13 It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for **works of service**, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.
