a.	The traditional service called <u>Majestic Grace</u> (8:15am) has a strong liturgical flow that is found in many LCMS congregations. There are man specific elements found in the traditional service, (Invocation, readings from the lectionary, Kyrie, Agnes Dei, Preface and Proper Preface, etc.)
b.	The contemporary service called NewSong (11:00am) has a very informal music-heavy style that is less common in the LCMS but is growing in popularity in some churches. This flow of worship, however, is common in many non-denominational churches. While it may not have as many specific liturgical elements as the traditional service, it does have the basics and foundational elements of worship.
