PRESENTATION:

What is Prayer, actually?

*Sometimes we pray for things that weigh heavy on our hearts (*i.e., a grandparent dying*). Praying for such things is good. Sometimes we pray whatever we're facing at the moment (*i.e., a test in algebra*). That is good too. Sometimes our prayers can be whimsical while other times we pray in a more structured, organized way. This is also good. In fact, the *structured* way, a "model" of prayer, helps us think about aspects we may not normally think and pray about.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

- Read Matthew 7:7-15
- Read through The Lord's Prayer in LSC pp 19-22.
